Inter-professional COVID-Palliative Core Competencies Self-Assessment tool for Generalist-ALL nurses, NPs, physicians, social workers, counsellors and health care assistants

Generalist-ALL: Generalists and specialists for life-limiting conditions (e.g., cardiology, nephrology, oncology). They provide direct care for any person, including those with life-limiting conditions, in any care setting. They use evidence-based guidelines and consultation with health care providers with enhanced or specialized palliative practice to provide care for people with basic palliative needs.

Instructions

The following competency self-assessment process has been adapted from Benner's novice-to-expert framework (Benner, 1984). It is intended to be used over time, to see progression in professional practice.

For each competency statement, rate your current practice from 1-3 as follows:

- 1. Novice Advanced beginner: may be a student, recent graduate, experienced or specialized clinician but new to palliative care and palliative approach. Can practice independently using some skills specific to palliative care with support
- 2. Competent mostly independent, occasionally seeks out support
- 3. Proficient Expert autonomous practice, seeks out leadership opportunities and may be sought out by others for advice or support
